

Dear Professor,

My name is Dr. Lisette Torres-Gerald. I am a member of a research team at TERC, a non-profit STEM education research and development organization in Cambridge, MA. My team and I are conducting a study called *Multiple Intersectionalities among Faculty in STEM: An Arts-Informed Exploratory Study (MIaFS)*. Our team is composed of Drs. Mia Ong, Nuria Jaumot-Pascual, and myself, and is being advised and supported by Dr. Luis Leyva from Vanderbilt University. We also count with the support of oSTEM-UGA. This project builds on our body of work that strives for equity and inclusion in STEM, including research with women of color, persons of color with disabilities, and two-spirit individuals.

We are contacting you as part of our recruitment efforts for this study. In this study, we want to learn about the lived experiences of LGBTQ2IA+ faculty of color in STEM. We are using the theoretical frameworks of intersectionality and QueerCrit to guide our work. The study uses a method called *arts-informed research*, where we ask participants to create artwork and/or take photographs that speak to their challenges and successes in STEM.

The study involves four steps, with an optional fifth step:

- 1. Watch a MIaFS orientation video (on our project webpage) about the processes involved in the study.
- 2. Create artwork or photographs **by June 14, 2021**, to answer the prompts that we will provide.
- 3. Participate in a one-on-one interview to talk about the artwork and/or photographs.
- 4. Work closely with the research team and all participants to design a 1-day virtual art symposium where participants can share their creations. We will select a mutually good time for everyone in early October.
- 5. Participate in an optional focus group that will be held for participants interested in meeting each other to share their experience with the project and as LGBTQ2IA+ faculty of color in STEM.

We are recruiting **faculty** who:

- Are employed at a college or university in the United States;
- Work on STEM-related topics;
- Have a doctorate (or other terminal degree) in a science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) discipline;
- Identify as being a person of color;
- Identify as being a member of the LGBTQ2IA+ community;
- Are open to creating art pieces or taking photographs, talking about them, and showing them in a public setting; and
- Are comfortable using a video conference system, such as Zoom, and being recorded.
